

About Nicor Gas

Nicor Gas delivers natural gas to over 2 million customers in a service territory that encompasses most of the northern third of Illinois, excluding the city of Chicago. The service area is characterized by a diverse and growing economy and a high demand for natural gas space heating among residential and commercial customers.

Areas Served:

Nicor Gas serves about 640 communities in the northern third of Illinois, outside the city of Chicago and the North Shore suburbs. See Exhibit A for a map of the Counties served by Nicor Gas and Exhibit B for a list of communities served from the Company's Ratebook.

Distribution System:

The Company is connected to eight interstate pipelines, providing access to competitively priced supplies from most of the major gas producing areas in North America. In addition, Nicor Gas operates over 30,000 miles of underground pipelines and seven underground storage aquifers, making its storage system one of the largest in the industry.

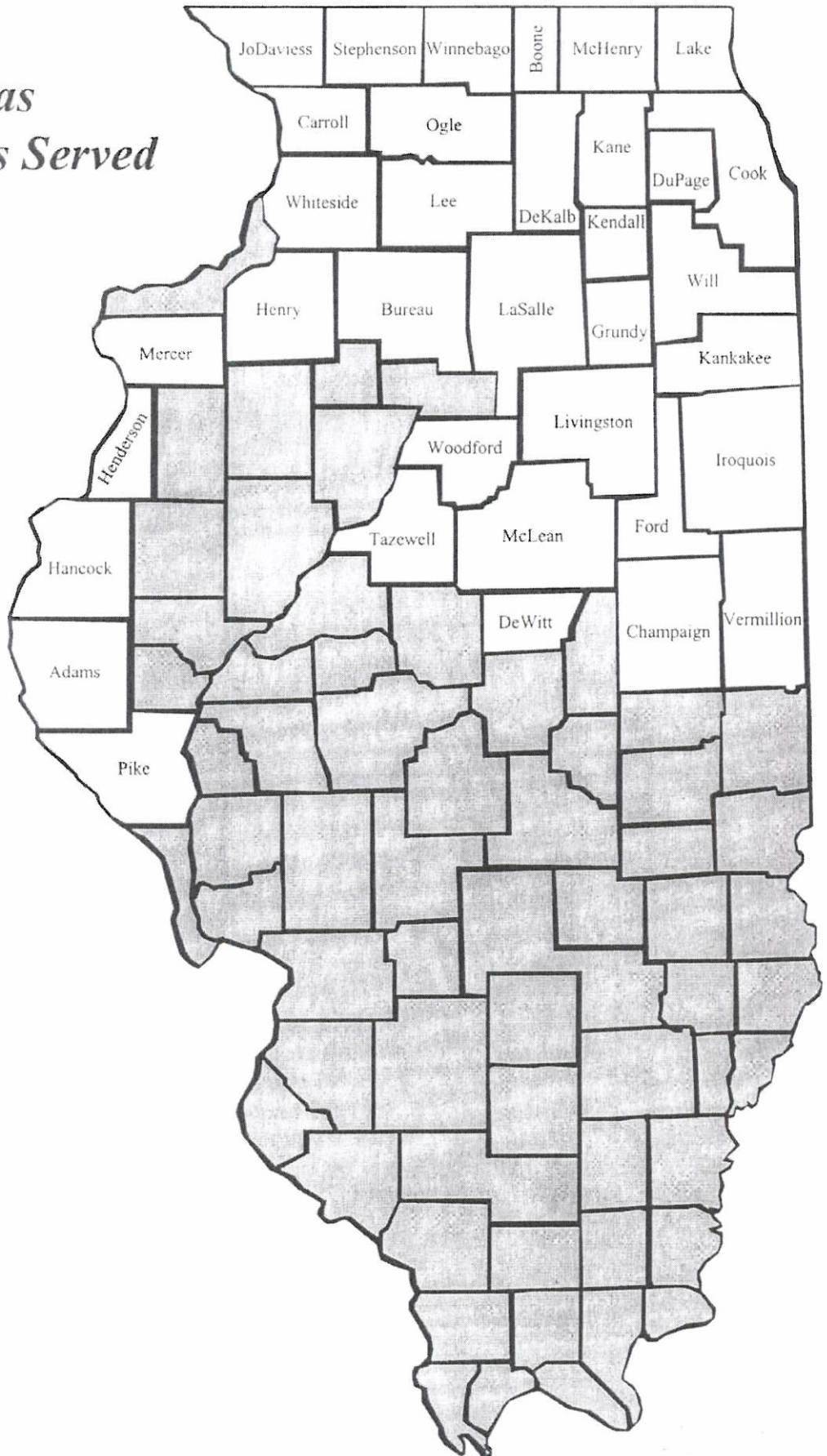
Customer Mix:

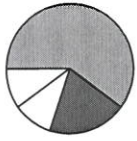

Illinois Commerce Commission (ICC)

The ICC establishes the rules and regulations governing utility rates and services. All investor-owned utilities operating in Illinois are regulated by the ICC. The ICC has five members (although currently there is one vacancy). Each is appointed for a five-year term by the governor and confirmed by the Illinois Senate. Under Illinois law, no more than three Commissioners may belong to the same political party.
